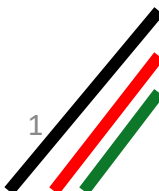

- ❑ The Kenya Vision 2030 has guided development planning since 2008.

- ❑ Implementation of the Kenya vision 2030 has been undertaken through 5-year successive Medium Term Plans (MTPs):
 - First MTP 2008-2012;
 - Second MTP 2013-2017;
 - Third MTP 2018-2022; and
 - Fourth MTP 2023-2027.

- ❑ The Fourth MTP (2023-2027) will transition the Country to the next long-term development plan.

- ❑ The Fourth MTP has been informed by :
 - ❖ Kenya Vision 2030;
 - ❖ Lessons learnt from previous MTPs;
 - ❖ The Plan: The Bottom Up Economic Transformation Agenda; and
 - ❖ Global and Regional Development Commitments e.g United Nations 2030 Agenda for sustainable development and the Africa Agenda 2063.

BETA OBJECTIVES

- ❑ The MTP IV been aligned to the Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA).
- ❑ The BETA is geared towards economic turnaround through a value chain approach.
- ❑ BETA has targeted sectors with the most impact to drive economic recovery to be achieved through six objectives:
 - i. Bringing down the cost of living;
 - ii. Eradicating hunger (zero hunger);
 - iii. Creating jobs;
 - iv. Expanding the tax base;
 - v. Improving foreign exchange balances; and
 - vi. Inclusive growth (leaving no one behind).





BETA CORE PILLARS

- ❑ To address the six (6) objectives the BETA has identified five (5) core pillars:
 - i. Agriculture ;
 - ii. Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise (MSME) economy;
 - iii. Housing and Settlement;
 - iv. Healthcare; and
 - v. Digital Superhighway and Creative Economy .
